Hebrew Word of the Month

Ahava Love

or say something like "much love and blessings to you and your family." In English, the word love is synonymous with a feeling. We feel love. It is a philosophical idea. But what is love in Hebrew?

The Hebrew word for love is "ahava" from the root word "ahav". Ahava is spelled aleph, hey, bet, hey (אהבה). The three basic letters that make up this word aleph (א), hey (ה), and bet (ב), are broken down into two parts: a two letter root-

hey and bet, and the first letter- aleph which is a modifier. The two letter root word is hav (בה), which means to give. The letter aleph which comes before these two letters is used to modify the root word of hav (בה) "give".

The Hebraic mindset sees love as more than the emotion, it is an action. The action of giving. Love is about doing something more than just feeling something. Love is giving. Giving creates and sustains love. The true relationships in our lives are those where mutual giving takes place. The giving can be physical, emotional, intellectual, or a combination. Giving is the key to love. "YHWH so loved the world that He GAVE His only Son."

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Our love for one another must be a central goal. We may not always agree on all the details as we are all works in progress, but we can freely give, we can love one another. Consider this month how we can love each other, how can we give to one another? What are some actions we can take to start loving, to start giving more to one another?

By doing this, we can start to bear one another's burdens. We can use the gifts that Yah has given us to help the body.

We are the Nation of Israel. We need to start acting like it. We need to put aside differences and learn to love each other and get along. There are certain doctrinal principals such as Salvation through Yeshua, but things like pronunciation of the name, calendar differences: they can and should be put aside for the sake of unity. However, we must open conversation in a council to study these doctrines.

How can we possibly be a light to the world if all they see is disunity and bickering between our small groups?

We have an opportunity every month to come together as a group, putting aside small differences and have fellowship together. We further have an opportunity on the 27th of August to come together to celebrate the life of a woman who showed us by example how to love. How to see past fellowship walls and to see the individuals.

Let us gather together and heal this body. Let us create the biblical model of the church: the qahal.




New Torah Fellowship

Lessons from a Tomato

Back in February my children and I started planting pepper and tomato seeds for our summer garden. Things went great. The seeds germinated, they got bigger. And bigger. And bigger. We calculated the warm days slightly wrong and ended up hauling about 75 plants in and out of the house daily for about a month. They all needed the nice warm sun, but the cold night temperatures were too much for them. These pepper and tomato plants became like babies to my kids and I. We spent a good hour a day tending to them, helping them keep growing, trying to keep them from tipping over from their own weight and moving them into bigger pots as they became root bound. You can imagine our excitement when planting day came when the temperatures were warm enough to get them in the ground. It was a lot of work, but with the help of my niece, we got them all in. We put in the time, the sweat, the work - I expected to get what we planned - pounds and pounds of tomatoes in the summer. And it was looking good...until it wasn't. Half the garden had unfertile soil we quickly learned. Then early blight started attacking our crop. Don't get me wrong, we have been getting a lot of 'maters. But it has not been the harvest I was dreaming of, the harvest I thought was reward for our work. It was discouraging to not see the fruits of our labor. It wasn't a lack of effort. It wasn't a lack of prayer. It was mistakes along the way. Small things we did wrong. We didn't test the soil. Not enough compost. We didn't stake the tomatoes right. Not only that - squash bugs came for the seeds we directly sowed.

Do I abandon this garden? Do I throw in the towel? Do I decide it's not worth the work and just buy tomatoes from the store next summer? No. Patient endurance is key. I will learn from my mistakes and try not to make the same ones next year, and then I will probably make new mistakes that I can learn from as well. We are all planting the seeds of Yeshua. We may find our own squash bugs or blight parallel to family and friends that don't give us the fruit we were hoping for from them. Rejection, scoffing, lukewarmness...We may encounter hearts that aren't ready yet, that need the Holy Spirit to fertilize them so that these seeds we are planting can grow in another season. Keep praying and don't give

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


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
