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
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order to meet these goals, men must mediate over issues that arise and bring unity and purity amongst the diversity.

Monthly Qahal Meeting








Greeneville News

The Freedom Story



Youth Field Trip

Cody Payne from A-1 Concrete and his brother Matt Payne from All Star Apparel and Awards hosted the youth for a tour of their facilities. They all met up at A-1 Concrete and then drove down the road to All-Star Apparel. There, Matt showed them how t-shirts are screen printed. Two designs were specially created on the screens for the kids to pick from. Once they made the selection, Matt showed them how to use the screen, and then they took home the shirt they helped print! You may see some of them wearing these shirts soon, and if you like the designs, let me know, as the Paynes printed a few extras.

After having a great time at All-Star Apparel, they returned to the concrete plant, where the children saw what goes into creating concrete. Cody explained what concrete is made of and how they measure the proportions and put it into the concrete truck. He tied in Scripture and explained how faith is just like concrete (see image to the right).

The teens went up into the office, where they helped Cody put in the weights for a 3,000 psi mix. The others watched as the conveyor belt brought the material up and dropped it into the concrete truck. Next, they watched as a concrete block was poured, learning how concrete gains strength over time and how the strength rate depends on weather conditions.

The younger children even got the opportunity to get into some of the heavy machinery! Shalom Studios (see page 7) was on the scene with their videographers, capturing some of the action, and they are very excited to share their footage on 4-22-24.

The youth and their parents are incredibly grateful to the Payne brothers for taking time out of their busy schedules to host the children and giving them memories that will last a lifetime!
