May Qahal in the Park



Their families showed great support, bringing them to the meetings, being personal cheerleaders, helping where needed, and providing much-needed nourishment between takes. We couldn't have done it without everyone involved.

The support they received off-set also made a huge impact. Words of encouragement, advice, and growing anticipation drove this group to put forth their best effort and create a stellar movie that many have enjoyed.

Filming was such a positive experience that they are now in pre-production talks for the next video or video series. It has not been decided what the story will be. Still, some ideas they toss around include: The Life of Yeshua, The Freedom Story Part 2: In The Wilderness, The Life of David, The Story of Esther, Judges, The 40 Years in the Wilderness and 40 Days of Yeshua Parallel. If you have a child interested in being part of the next film, now is the time to let us know! Our first meeting will be on May 23rd, and we will meet about every other week. The teens shot the Freedom Story with my Canon R6 camera and used my MacBook Pro with Adobe software for editing. We did have two additional Canon Rebel cameras, but their footage didn't compare to the R6 camera, so many potentially good shots from 2 other teens were wasted.

Besides my computer, there was not a powerful computer for the teens to work with that had enough memory - so for them to increase their skills in ministry, more technology will be needed (when it comes to video editing you need a powerful computer with at least 2 TB of memory to do it). It was the same case for the soundtrack. All the music was created and produced by teens using what they had, but an increase in technology would help. The costumes, you may have noticed, were made on a low budget – parents simply went through their homes and found old sheets, pillowcases, and fabric. We made do with what we had, and I believe it turned out great! But we do want to move forward and keep building on lessons learned.





There is so much talent among this group with a considerable willingness to serve the Father. I hope that as more people hear about this, even more youth will listen to the calling to join in! We did great with the last film using what we had and will continue to use whatever the Father blesses us with, whether a little or a lot. Funding will help this group increase productivity and quality. If you don't ask, you will never receive, so we are asking: are you willing and able to help this group somehow? Small donations would help with costumes, props, and sets. More significant contributions will help with technology (cameras, lighting, microphones and computers).
