Hebrews 4:16 Therefore let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and find grace whenever we need help.

We must come to understand how much higher and grander and greater the honor and respect ought to be for the Creator of All things and for the King of Kings and begin functioning in that understanding and walking in it, meaning living it!

Morgan County Tornado

Around 8 pm on Thursday, February 6th, an EF-2 tornado tore through Morgan County. The Huth's home was at the location that experienced the most damaging winds. The tornado passed directly over their home in Deer Lodge, uprooting trees on both sides. It felt like nothing short of a miracle to see their home amidst all the destruction around. Huge trees were toppled everywhere, their workshop and barn were destroyed, and the contents of their garage were scattered. The tornado caused the garage door to blow out—yet their home remained intact, with not even a broken window. Remarkably, Sara was on her way home that night with her car full and was driving right through the storm. It was a miracle that the trees that fell across the road, blocking her path home, did not land on their vehicle. Furthermore, once they reached the point where they could go no further through the pitch-black night, Chris and the neighbors cleared a path through the debris so they could return home.

Many from the Qahal community came out this past Sunday to assist with the massive cleanup. The consistent feedback I kept hearing was that the destruction was far worse than anyone anticipated. Their property looked like a bomb had exploded; it was heartbreaking to witness. Moises was reminded of the verse from Isaiah 1:8:

"So the daughter of Zion is left as a booth in a vineyard, As a hut in a garden of cucumbers, As a besieged city."

It was as if everything surrounding the Huths' home lay desolate, like the withered vines of a cucumber garden around the watchman's hut. In other words, the home stood safe amidst the ruins caused by the storm, much like that hut in the cucumber garden.

Yah truly had a protective barrier around their home and vehicle, preserving all their lives while providing them a warm and sheltered place to return to. This did not go unnoticed and was one of the first things they expressed to others—how completely grateful they are to Yah for the miracle He bestowed upon them. Sara expressed how she couldn't be angry or upset; the destruction is immense, but they are alive and still have their home. The outpouring of community help and prayers has been amazing and heartfelt.

That said, the Huth family will require ongoing assistance to restore their property. Some immediate needs include getting their septic system functioning properly, rebuilding their chicken coop (the chickens are currently residing under a trampoline), recovering tools and other belongings that have been buried, cleaning up the collapsed workshop and barn, and other property cleanup tasks. "We had a two story shop up here that's totally flat and with my husband's machinery and every tool, tractor everything out there and that all got flattened. The hay barn up the road a little bit more on our property that also is flat. Our house is fine. We had a clean, dry, warm place to be that night. So, I mean, really, you can't be anything but thankful," said Sara.

Matthew 21:22 If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer.

When He gave the disciples instructions on how to pray, there was so much 'protocol' regarding how we are to pray to Yahuah, if you will. We acknowledge who He is and His due Honor to His Name and to His Kingdom and to His Authority (His Will). Only after we have done so does Yahusha say we are then able to ask for anything. And the things He said we are to ask for is our daily bread (sustenance in the physical aspect, His Word for the spiritual body) and forgiveness and deliverance. When we ask for forgiveness, it is with the understanding that we have already forgiven others who have sinned against us.

Matthew 6:9-14 This, then, is how you should pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name, Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from the evil one.

For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their sins, your heavenly Father will not forgive your sins.

Even after giving the protocols of how we should pray, we are given further instruction in Matthew 6 that if we seek first His kingdom, His ways, to be obedient to Him that we will not even need to pray for our needs, for He is a good Father who knows of what we need and what is good to give.

Matthew 6:33 "But seek first the reign of Elohim, and His righteousness, and all these shall be added to you."

Psalms 100:4 Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, And into His courts with praise. Give thanks to Him; bless His Name.

This is how we are to enter into His presence! Not brazenly, not entitled. We are to acknowledge Him and His goodness He has already been to us who are undeserving. Another point, the understanding of what the word 'believe' means is much more than an intellectual acceptance, it means we demonstrate our belief in Him by our obedient actions to His instructions given to us in His Torah. So, you see, there are protocols and requirements to take our requests to Him. If we are seeking Him and His Kingdom/His ways, we learn how to walk in His righteousness and how to appropriately love Him and our neighbor. We learn that we only have the 'right' to go to Him because of Yahusha and that should humble us, not make us behave in an entitled manner. Proverbs 28:9 He that turns away his ear from hearing the law, even he has made his prayer abominable.

We also must be willing to humble ourselves before men and before the King.

Titus 3:1-2 Remind the people to be subject to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready to do whatever is good, to slander no one, to be peaceable and considerate, and to show true humility toward all men.

Philippians 2:1-11 is our Messiah's perfect example of humility. Here it is from the TS2009:

If, then, there is any encouragement in Messiah, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of Spirit, if any affection and compassion, make my joy complete by being of the same mind, having the same love, one in being and of purpose, doing none at all through selfishness or self-conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each one should look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others. For, let this mind be in you which was also in Messiah my, who, being in the form of Elohim, did not regard equality with Elohim a matter to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant, and came to be in the likeness of men. And having been found in fashion as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, death even of a stake. Elohim, therefore, has highly exalted Him and given Him the Name which is above every name, that at the Name of "primy" every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, and every tongue should confess (Isa_45:23) that "primy" Messiah is Master, to the esteem of Elohim the Father.

Bottom line, Yahuah deserves all the Honor and Glory and Praise, but He desires that we give it and show it to one another before coming before Him to give it because if we try to give it to Him without giving it to one another it is false humility and dishonor to Him, truly. If we have bitterness and unforgiveness in our hearts, how can our hearts be full of love and honor and praise for Him? I pray each of us will take this into serious consideration and prayer, asking Him for the wisdom to understand that He will give without measure to the one who asks.

James 1:5 But if anyone is deficient in wisdom, he should ask Yahuah, who gives to all generously and without reprimand, and it will be given to him. Praise Him for all His goodness! He says that if we will just humble ourselves, seek Him, make things right with our fellow man, He has wisdom and all manner of good to bestow upon us!

He started revealing much of this to me back in 2012. I tried to rewrite what I had written back then so it wasn't quite so long, but those who know me know that's a difficult task right there... Thank you for your time and attention. Also, thank you for allowing me the grace to use the names He has put on our heart when referring to Him. I hope this blesses you and is helpful to you in your walk. Much Shalom to you and your households.

It's 12:30am, and I'm awake. Walking and bouncing a baby boy who is going through the 4-month sleep regression where his sleep cycles change from that of a baby to that of an adult. He spends half of his time crying and fussing and the other half sucking on his fingers with sleep laden eyes. Laying him down too soon only results in screaming that will wake up my husband who needs his sleep for work the next day. There are tears.... Tears of frustration, tears of exhaustion, tears of "Yah, I don't know how to parent this child you have given us." I love my son, but this is hard.

As I walk and bounce, I think. I think of the mothers before me and I wonder how they handled this. How did Eve, the first mama, handle a fussy baby who didn't want to be put down? Especially since she had no other mothers to ask for advice. How did Sarah manage with Isaac when she was in her nineties? How did Rebecca manage with twins? I think of Jachobed and wonder if this sleep regression, and the incessant crying is what caused her to place her son in a basket in the river to try and save his life? All these questions dance through my mind in the wee hours of the morning.

Outcomes

"For every action, there is an equal and opposite reaction." Though Isaac Newton coined this phrase to describe the concept of outcomes as demonstrated through force in the physical realm, a similar sentiment was given by the Bible long before to relate how outcomes operate in the spiritual realm. Galatians 6:7 reads "Don't be deceived: God is not mocked. For whatever a person sows he will also reap." Our choices lead to certain outcomes.

The entire book of Obadiah, a letter to the people of Esau/ Edom, amounts to a single message which may be well summed up by verse 15: "The day of the LORD is near for all nations. As you have done, it will be done to you; your deeds will return upon your own head." The book begins by articulating that the people of Edom, in their pride, had considered themselves high as they created their civilization on a mountaintop. God responds with a proportional judgement, stating that He will bring them down to the lowest depths (v 3-4).

Truly the choices we make and the actions we live out in this life are not of no consequence. Each choice we make and the intention behind those choices may impact our very salvation and destinies. This principle is illustrated throughout the life of Jacob. Considering the series of events of the Biblical patriarch's life, what stands out is a seamless sequence of characters experiencing the outcomes of their actions, good or bad.

Beginning in Genesis 25, Esau's choice to trade his birthright for a bowl of Jacob's stew affects the outcome of his own destiny and the generations to follow. In one moment of weakness a decision to feed the flesh at any cost resulted in the removal of the most precious asset Esau actually possessed. Later Jacob participates in Rebecca's plan to deceive his dad into giving him Esau's firstborn blessing. Yet Esau wasn't the only one to experience the negative outcomes of these choices.

It is per the very rule of the elder child's birthright that Jacob himself is later deceived and robbed of the wife he worked for when Laban gives him the older daughter, Leah, in marriage rather than the younger Rachel. Can you imagine the dagger that must have pierced Jacob's heart when he heard the words from Laban, "It is not our custom here to give the younger daughter in marriage before the older one." Ouch. The right of the older sibling that he had schemed to work around is the very rule that came back to bite him, and Jacob was deceived in a similar manner of hidden identities with which he had deceived his own father. Even in a foreign land far from anyone who was aware of what he had done, Jacob was unable to escape justice - an important reminder for us that nothing is hidden from God's sight even if hidden from man.

Further, there is no indication in the Bible that Rebecca ever saw Jacob again after he fled from Esau's wrath over the stolen blessing. It is likely that her actions resulted in the loss of any further relationship with Jacob, which generates a sad irony to consider that her favored son would not have been present for her death and burial due to her willingness to invoke nefarious means to secure for him a favorable destiny.

We also see Laban experience outcomes in proportion to his actions. In Genesis 30-31, the scriptures indicate that Laban was stingy with payment for the labor he'd received from Jacob, changing his wages ten times, and attempting to rob Jacob of the agreed-upon "speckled and spotted sheep" by hiding them away under the care of his other sons. In response to this, God transfers Laban's wealth to Jacob by giving an abundance of speckled and spotted flock offspring. The very one from whom Laban attempted to cheat and steal wealth ends up being the recipient of all of Laban's wealth.

As the family flees from Laban, Rachel steals Laban's idol and hides it, lying to her dad. Unaware that Rachel had stolen the idols, Jacob spoke, "whoever has done this will die." Rachel indeed soon died upon giving birth to his son Benjamin, just as he had spoken. Though Laban didn't find the idols, the guilty party was known by God. Since the Bible states that the power of life and death is in the tongue, we can be assured that even the choices we make with our words wield great power which leads to certain outcomes.


Moment by moment, day by day, we are faced with the choices that will impact our destinies. What choice would we make in the moment if we were truly aware of the significant impact of the seemingly-small things? Would we choose to wake up early and spend time with the Father rather than pacify the flesh by hitting the snooze button? Would we choose to nourish our bodies with nutritious fuel rather than answer the call of our flesh to finish the last donut in the box? Would we choose to use our time being present with our families rather than allow ourselves to be distracted by the bombarding media and voices vying for our time, attention, and money? Surely all of these decisions would be easier if we could just maintain the awareness that such choices would lead to destiny-affecting outcomes.

As we see in the story of Jacob's life, every choice that we make is actually an opportunity to bring upon ourselves blessings and good gifts from our Heavenly Father, or to bring upon ourselves generational and eternal consequences. Whether we use our words to bless or to curse, or use our hands to steal or to serve - the choice is ours to make, as is the outcome.
